- 1. The respondents are public agencies.
- 2. Complainant requests from respondent Town the written cirteria used to select persons for a federally-funded laborer position within the Town as well as the applications submitted by successful applicants for this position.
- 3. Complainant bases this request on the ground that respondent practiced favoritism in awarding positions.
- 4. A competitive examination in which only four positions, requiring skills that are not unusual, are awarded among 164 applicants makes favoritism possible.
- 5. The Town has tendered to complainant the written criteria (Exhibit A), but resists disclosure of the applications as an invasion of personal privacy.
- 6. The application form contains material relating to employment;, past and present income, criminal record, health, and other information, the disclosure of which would constitute an invasion of personal privacy.
- 7. Applications submitted by persons other than the complainant himself are therefore exempt from disclosure under Section 2(b)(1) of P.A. 75-342.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above captioned complaint:

Except as to Exhibit A, a copy of which will be provided, the complaint is dismissed.
