The above captioned matter was heard as a contested case on July 15, 1977, at which time the complainant and the respondent authority appeared and presented testimony and argument on the complaint.

After consideration of the entire record, the following facts are found:

- 1. The respondent authority is a public agency as defined in §1-18a (a), G.S.
- 2. At approximately 2:00 p.m. on June 13, 1977, the complainant herein requested access to see and inspect the minutes of the respondent authority's meeting of June 6, 1977.
  - 3. Such minutes had not been produced at that time.
- 4. By letter filed with the Commission on June 14, 1977, the complainant alleged that she was wrongfully denied access to such minutes.
- 5. §1-21, G.S. states, in pertinent part, that "minutes shall be available for public inspection within seven days of the session to which they refer.".
- 6. The minutes in question refer to a sesion of the respondent authority which convened at 9:12 p.m. on June 6, 1977.
- 7. Such minutes were produced some time prior to 9:00 p.m. on June 13, 1977, although they were not ready at the time of the complainant's request on the same date.
- 8. It is found that the respondent authority has complied with the time requirements prescribed by \$1-21, G.S. for the production of the minutes of its June 16, 1977 meeting.
- 9. Accordingly, the complainant was not denied the right to inspect or copy such record.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above captioned complaint:

1. The complaint is hereby dismissed.
