The above captioned matter was heard as a contested case on February 15, 1978, at which time the complainant and the respondent town and the respondent council appeared, stipulated to certain facts, and presented testimony, exhibits and argument on the complaint.

After consideration of the entire record, the following facts are found:

- 1. By letter received by the Commission on December 27, 1977, the complainant alleged that the respondent investigating committee did not file minutes for certain meetings held in 1977.
- 2. The issue at hearing was whether each of the respondent investigating committee's meetings are meetings of a public agency as defined by \$1-18a(a), G.S. and, as such, subject to all of the requirements of the Freedom of Information Act concerning minutes.
- 3. At the time of hearing, the respondent investigating committee was defunct.
- 4. Such issue therefore need not be decided by the Commission at this time.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record concerning the above captioned complaint:

- 1. The complaint is hereby dismissed.
- 2. The Commission notes that verbatim transcripts exist for all but 4 of the so-called meetings in 1977 of the respondent investigating committee and that the complete transcripts of those gatherings are now kept on file in the office of the respondent council.
