I went to your office to keep our appointment, and it was no surprise that you were "out sick". This has happened in many in-Commence of the commence of th stances.

Mr. Pearlman had only a few minutes to see me. He gave me a copy of new legislation, did not have enought ime to answer any other questions I wanted to ask. Someone called him and discussed a personal problem re; bankruptcy, at great length, then, he told me he "had to go out in fifteen minutes".

I stayed at your office, trying to make some calls, and he did not ge out. In fact, he told me I "needed a lawyer" I told him I could not get a lawyer due to F.B.I. interference (and probably other liasons), and he said "I can't believe you can't get a lawyer". This refrain has been made to me at least two dozen times in the last several months.

I realize you have been pressured to take the position you have assumed, in assisting me. Fet two years, this has been the case.

As I told you before, you are supposed to be working for the FOIC, and I am just as entitled to have my files, as any other American Citizen, REGARDLESS of the reasons you are given by the F.B.I which, have been altered to suit each different situation, to pretect them and others from the many abuses they have infliced on me.

Again, I wish to state that I want to cancel the hearings. I wish to discuss matters with you, and will make another appointment and trust you will be well, when I arrive.

The Complainant and all Respondents are expressly advised that each of you shall be entitled to be represented by your respective attorney at the hearing, that you will be permitted to examine and cross-examine any witnesses who give testimony concerning these charges, and that you will be permitted to present witnesses and other evidence and arguments at the hearing of this matter.
- 5. The procedural regulations heretofore promulgated by the Freedom of Information Commission shall govern this hearing, which will be conducted as a contested case under Chapter 54 of the Connecticut General Statutes. If you have any questions concerning your obligations under this order to show cause, the Commission suggests that you contact your counsel or the Commission's counsel.

- 6. Commissioner Judith Lahey is hereby designated as hearing officer to conduct this hearing at the time and place herein specified and at any time and place to which the hearing may be adjourned, and to report in writing to the Commission concerning the facts and the issues presented on the record of this contested case.
