The above captioned matter was heard as a contested case on May 4, 1977, at which time the complainant and the respondent superintendent appeared, stipulated to certain facts, and presented testimony, exhibits and argument on the complaint.

After consideration of the entire record, the following facts are found:

- 1. The respondents are public agencies as defined by §1-18a(a), G.S.
- 2. By letter dated March 10, 1977, the complainant requested from the respondent superintendent copies of the roster of the town of Griswold's public school personnel, their salaries and the academic and professional requirements for their positions.
- 3. By letter of appeal filed with the Commission on March 24, 1977, the complainant alleged that the respondent superintendent failed to comply with that part of the aforesaid request relating to the academic and professional requirements of teachers, in violation of his rights under P.A. 75-342, as codified in Chapter 3 of the General Statutes.
- 4. It was shown at the hearing herein that all of the records relating to the aforesaid request were made available to the complainant on March 17, 1977.
- 5. The complainant pursued the present appeal in the hopes of having this Commission treat documents that were not referred to in his March 10, 1977 letter of request and the subsequent appeal thereof.

The following order by the Commission is hereby recommended on the basis of the record and findings concerning the above captioned matter:

1. The complaint is hereby dismissed.
