- Thanks for starting on time


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- More discussions on the work and recommendations

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Purpose:


- To showcase areas of best practice across Connecticut to inform the CCTF regarding recommendations for implementation

Process:

- **Selection of Districts:** Co-Chair Selection
- **CCTF Visit:** 5-6 CCTF Members will visit the selected district and meet core district personnel (Superintendent, Asst. Superintendent, Curriculum Director, Teacher etc.) to observe, meet and discuss district implementation of the CCSS. Specific activities and personnel will be determined by the Superintendent or designee of the selected district. The CCTF visit should take no more than 2 hours as appropriate.
- **Observation Lens:** CCTF Logic Framework (Next Slide)
 - Throughout the visit, the CCTF visiting team will use the logic framework to organize district focus points regarding implementation strengths and suggestions





Recommendations must be...	Evidence Based	Actionable	Inclusive of all stakeholders	Measurable
	-Recommendations must stem from an identified challenge/concern in implementation substantiated by data.	-Recommendations must be obtainable, actionable, and grounded in solid educational practice. Recommendations must be specific and targeted. Recommendations must be sustainable over time.	-Recommendations must include opportunities for participation by multiple stakeholder groups. Recommendations must focus and provide solutions that improve learning for students.	-Recommendations must be measurable in regards to their effectiveness. Recommendations must provide a clear deliverable/measure regarding their long term impact/success.

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

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
