- a. Key Takeaways: It is important to have the conversation, focus, policy and funding on school safety months down the road from an incident, not just in its wake. When there is a decrease in prevention and intervention, it's clear we see an increase in incidents and lawsuits. School districts face a continuum of threats—so there must be a continuum of responses. Avoid solutions that are difficult to implement, such as metal detectors at every door. Ensure policy is comprehensive, but not overly prescriptive.
