

Transportation Funding

- Gas tax still the short- to mid-term solution
- Fees secondary source of revenues
- Mileage-based user fee





- Comprehensive, balanced transportation funding plan
- Project paid entirely by tolls
- Project funded partly with toll revenues



Maximizing Revenue from Non-Toll (and Non-Tax) Sources

- Not a major source of revenue
- Highway and Bridge
- Transit/Transit-Oriented Development (TOD)



Federal Law on Tolling

- Prohibits tolling of an existing interstate
- New capacity can be tolled
- Future Federal Law

- There is no right or wrong answer
















- All-Electronic Tolling (AET)

- AET to Start vs Conversion to AET






How Tolls Might be Implemented
