### **REASON FOR REQUEST:**

In accordance with Section 73 of Public Act 13–239 the authorization of the issuance of bonds of the state for the Connecticut Bioscience Innovation Fund in principal amounts not exceeding in the aggregate two hundred million dollars (\$200,000,000) plus costs of issuance and capitalized interest, if any, and the memorandum of understanding providing for the issuance of said bonds shall be approved by the State Bond Commission. Also in accordance with Public Act 86–420, as amended, revenue bonds shall not constitute a charge, lien or encumbrance, legal or equitable, upon any property of the State or of any political subdivision thereof, except the property mortgaged or otherwise encumbered under the provisions and for the purposes of Sections 22a–475 to 22a–483 of the General Statutes, inclusive.
