REASON FOR REQUEST:

The financing plan for the Adriaen's Landing Convention Center Project contemplates a portion of the required funds will be provided through the issuance of revenue bonds of the Authority or term loans in an aggregate amount not to exceed \$100,000,000. No such bonds or term loans can be issued or entered into without the approval of the State Bond Commission, following a finding that such bonds are in the public interest and after State general obligation bonds have been authorized by the State Bond Commission for the Project. In addition, the State Treasurer and the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management propose to enter into a contract to provide assistance to the Authority pursuant to Section 32-608 of the Connecticut General Statutes by paying an amount not to exceed the annual debt service on the revenue bonds to be issued by the Authority, and limited to no more than \$6,750,000 per year. The Board of Directors of the Authority has found and determined that the incremental tax revenues under the authority of law presently existing as a result of the Convention Center Project and visitor spending with respect thereto are reasonably expected to offset, over the term of the bonds, the amount of debt service expected to be paid on the revenue bonds to which the contract assistance will be applied. The Secretary and the State Treasurer concur with the findings of the Authority's Board of Directors, and have filed a certificate evidencing such concurrence with the clerks of the Senate and the House of Representatives. In order to enter into construction and other contractual commitments, the Authority has approved revenue bonds in this amount, and requests State Bond Commission approval. The actual terms of the bonds and the term loans will be established at the time of issuance or entry, following further action by the Authority, and the terms of the contract providing for assistance will include such provisions as the Secretary and the State Treasurer deem necessary to assure the efficient construction and operation of the project, and as they find are in the best interests of the State.

SUGGESTED RESOLUTION:

The State Bond Commission FINDS AND DETERMINES, that the issuance by the Capital City Economic Development Authority of its revenue bonds and the entry into term loans in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$100,000,000 is in the public interest and AUTHORIZES the Authority to issue such revenue bonds and enter into such term loans. The State Bond Commission also FINDS AND DETERMINES that pursuant to Section 32-608 of the Connecticut General Statutes, the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management and the State Treasurer may enter into a contract assistance agreement with the Authority in order to reduce the cost of borrowing and to assure the efficient construction and operation of the project. The Authority is authorized to issue such bonds at public sale on sealed proposals or by negotiation, in such manner, at such price or prices, at such time or times, and on such terms and conditions as the Authority shall determine to be in the best interests of the Authority. The Authority is authorized to enter into such term loans on such terms and conditions, and such rates, as the Authority shall determine to be in the best interests of the Authority.

The Authority is authorized to enter into agreements on behalf of the Authority with respect to the issuance and sale of said bonds, including financial advisory agreements, bond purchase agreements, secondary market disclosure agreements, tax regulatory agreements and agreements with respect to the issuance, sale and securing of such bonds.

The Authority is authorized to determine the form, date or dates, maturities of serial or term bonds, date and manner of sale, interest rate or rates and due dates thereof (including the issuance of such bonds at fixed rates or variable rates, and as capital appreciation or current interest bonds), the denominations and designation of such bonds, registration, conversion and transfer privileges, the terms of redemption with or without premium, the priority and source of payment and all other terms and conditions of such bonds and of the issuance and sale thereof, as it shall determine to be in the best interests of the Authority.

The Authority is authorized to enter into agreements on behalf of the Authority with respect to the issuance and sale of said bonds, including financial advisory agreements, bond purchase agreements, secondary market disclosure agreements, tax regulatory agreements and agreements with respect to the issuance, sale and securing of such bonds.

The Authority is authorized to determine the form, date or dates, maturities of serial or term bonds, date and manner of sale, interest rate or rates and due dates thereof (including the issuance of such bonds at fixed rates or variable rates, and as capital appreciation or current interest bonds), the denominations and designation of such bonds, registration, conversion and transfer privileges, the terms of redemption with or without premium, the priority and source of payment and all other terms and conditions of such bonds and of the issuance and sale thereof, as it shall determine to be in the best interests of the Authority.

A study undertaken by the Town of Vernon revealed that the dam's embankment is in poor structural condition with several seepage areas on the downstream toe of the dam. The spillway capacity is also inadequate and upstream earthen embankments are experiencing erosion.

II. Army Corps Flood Control Project, Winsted and Torrington: These funds are requested to provide design funding for replacement of debris management structures for two flood control dams in Winsted and Torrington. Both dams are Stateowned and considered high hazard.

After the disastrous floods of 1955, the US Army Corps of Engineers and the State of Connecticut designed and constructed the Mad River and John Minetto flood detention dams. Recent inspections revealed that the debris management structures (log booms) have deteriorated to the point where they have lost both structural strength and the ability to float.

The results of the design will include a detailed site investigation and dam inspection, the development of several improvement alternatives and cost estimates, investigation of replacement structures (recycled synthetic material), property mapping information, engineering design services and development of contract documents needed for bidding purposes.
