The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) along with its key education partners in the state strongly believe that Connecticut's K-12 public education system must not only emphasize rigorous, well-rounded academics and citizenship, but also offer innovative and flexible career pathways and programs of study that align to the state's workforce needs. To support the development of such pathways in districts across Connecticut, the CSDE worked with higher education, business/industry, state agencies, and community organizations to create the following guiding documents:

Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment (CLNA) Guidelines

The CLNA is a data-driven decision-making process to be conducted by districts and stakeholders in the 2019–20 school year to align planning, spending, and accountability activities pertaining to career and technical education (CTE) pathways and programs and study.
