The Grades 3 – 8 Smarter Balanced DTC is equivalent to the CMT DTC and the Smarter Balanced High School DTC is equivalent to the CAPT DTC. Digital Library Preview

As students return to the classroom, we would like to introduce the Smarter Balanced Digital Library as a valuable instructional tool. The Digital Library is an online collection of instructional and professional learning resources. It features more than 1,500 resources aligned to the Common Core State Standards and vetted by educators using quality criteria.

- Resources include lesson plans, unit plans, rubrics, instructional strategies, and professional learning materials. It also includes collaborative features that allow educators to rate resources and to pose questions and share expertise through online forums.
- The Digital Library was created by and for educators to support implementation of the Common Core State Standards using the formative assessment process. A third-grade teacher from Washington state notes: "The Digital Library is full of hands-on, ready-to-use resources and strategies for teachers across the nation to create high-quality classroom lessons for students."



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• The Digital Library preview period runs through September 30, 2014. Connecticut educators will continue to have access to the Digital Library after this date.

Practice Tests

The Smarter Balanced Practice Test allows teachers, students, parents, and other interested parties to experience a full grade-level assessment. The Practice Tests mirror the year-end assessment. Each grade level assessment includes a variety of question types and difficulty (approximately 30 items each in English language arts/literacy (ELA) and mathematics), as well as an ELA and mathematics performance task at each grade level (3–8 and 11). The latest version of the Practice Tests (updated in May 2014) include additional universal tools, designated supports, and accommodations that were not available in the previous version. All language supports, including translated glossaries and stacked Spanish translation, are available on mathematics Practice and Training Tests.





THE CONNECTICUT ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT (CTAA) NEWS

Recruitment for the National Center and State Collaborative Phase 2 Pilot Test

The Connecticut Alternate Assessment (CTAA) which was developed with the National Center and State Collaborative (NCSC) will be administered in mathematics and English language arts in the spring of 2015 to students with significant cognitive disabilities. The NCSC will be conducting a second Pilot from October 20 - November 14, 2014, for students with significant cognitive disabilities in Grades 4 - 9 and 12 to continue the test development process. The National Center and State Collaborative Phase 2 Pilot Test letter was provided to District Test Coordinators with specifics about the Pilot and contact information for participation.
